Itinerary Summary

- **07:00–07:45 AM:** Pick up from accommodation in **Puerto Natales**.
- Stop at **Villa Cerro Castillo** – café, souvenirs, restrooms.
- Visit **Lago Sarmiento Viewpoint** – first panoramic view of the **Paine Massif**.
- Stop at **Laguna Amarga** and **Paine Waterfall**.
- Entry through **Laguna Amarga Gate** into **Torres del Paine National Park**.
- **Nordenskjöld Lake** and **Salto Grande Viewpoints** – short walk and stunning views.
- Stop at **Lake Pehoé** – turquoise waters, lunch, and photography.
- Continue to **Grey Lake Sector** – 1-hour moderate walk to see icebergs and **Grey Glacier**.
- Return via **Serrano Gate**, stop at **Grey Viewpoint** and **Lake Toro**.
- Visit **Milodon Cave Natural Monument**.
- **Return to Puerto Natales:** around **6:00 PM**.



Itinerary

- **07:00 to 07:45 AM – Pick up**
We'll begin our adventure with pick up from your accommodation in Puerto Natales. From there, we'll head north along Route 9 towards Torres del Paine National Park.
- Our first stop will be **Villa Cerro Castillo**, a small and historic border town with Argentina, deeply rooted in livestock farming. Here, we'll visit the main souvenir shop, enjoy a coffee there, and take a short restroom break.
- We'll then continue our journey to the **Lago Sarmiento viewpoint**, where we'll learn about the lake's unique geological features and enjoy our first panoramic views of the **Paine Massif** and part of the **Patagonian Andes**, along with a chance to spot some of the area's characteristic wildlife.
- Next, we'll stop at the **Laguna Amarga viewpoint**, located at the foot of the lagoon of the same name, offering a stunning view of the **Torres del Paine**. Before entering the park, we'll take a short detour to visit **Paine Waterfall**, our first encounter with the Paine River — the main watercourse of the park — where we'll see its rapids and waterfalls cascading through the rugged landscape.



Itinerary

- We'll enter the **Torres del Paine National Park** through the Laguna Amarga gate. After registration, our full day tour begins, traveling from east to west along the park's main internal routes. As we ascend, we'll see fascinating geological formations that reveal the glacial activity that shaped this incredible region.
- Along the way, we'll pass several lagoons rich in birdlife until we reach the **Nordenskjöld Lake viewpoint**, where we'll admire its turquoise waters and the majestic backdrop of the **Paine Massif**, while our guide shares insights into the area's geology.
- Our next stop will be the **Salto Grande viewpoint**, where we'll take a short, 15-minute walk (low difficulty) to visit this spectacular waterfall — a 12-meter drop connecting **Lake Nordenskjöld** with **Lake Pehoé**. As we climb a small hill, we'll be rewarded with one of the most iconic views of the **Cuernos del Paine**.
- We'll continue to the **Pehoé Lake area**, famous for its turquoise waters and breathtaking views. Here, you'll have time to enjoy lunch (either at the site or your packed lunch) and take photos of the surrounding landscapes and wildlife.



Itinerary

- After lunch, we'll continue towards the **Lago Grey sector**, passing through **Puente Weber** and **Park Administration**, located at the former **Río Paine Ranch**, an important part of the region's livestock heritage and the origin of the park itself.
- At **Grey Lake**, we'll take a moderate 1-hour round-trip walk through a beautiful **Lenga forest (Nothofagus pumilio)** to reach the lake's shore, where you'll be able to admire its gray waters dotted with floating icebergs. From here, you'll have a distant view of the **Grey Glacier, Paine Grande**, and the snow-covered peaks of the **Olguín Range** — an unforgettable sight.
- We'll then return along the same route, exiting the park through the **Serrano Gate**, and begin our journey back to Puerto Natales via Route Y-290. On the way, we'll make a brief stop at the **Grey viewpoint**, offering distant views of the glacier, the Serrano River basin, and **Lake Toro**.
- Our final stop will be at the **Milodon Cave Natural Monument**, a fascinating archaeological and paleontological site composed of glacial caves, remarkable for their size and historical importance.
- **Return to Puerto Natales: Around 6:00 PM**
